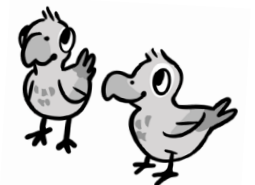
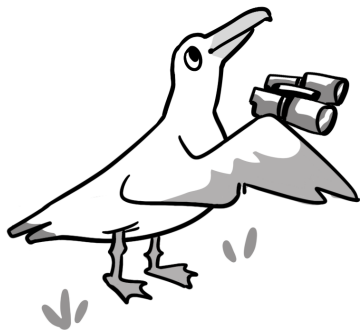

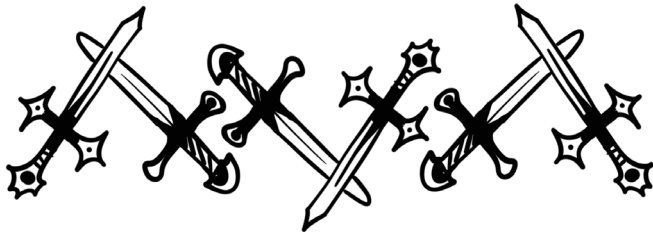


# HEALTHCARE SERVICES

## Maine's Shield Law

Maine being a **shield state** ensures protection for patients and providers of reproductive and gender affirming care. It shields Mainers and individuals who travel to Maine for care, as well as the providers who offer it, from legal attacks stemming from other states' laws.

- Healthcare providers in Maine cannot face professional discipline or civil liability for providing this type of care, and are granted address confidentiality.
- Patient's medical information related to reproductive and gender-affirming care remains private, especially from legal challenges in other states.



**TIP!**

### Safe sharps disposal in Maine:

Make your own sharps container using a heavy puncture-proof plastic bottle, such as empty laundry detergent containers. When it's full, seal it with the cap and heavy-duty tape, mark "SHARPS - Do Not Recycle" and simply place in your household trash.

## CONTRACEPTIVE

Birth control is available through Planned Parenthood, Maine Family Planning, Mabel Wadsworth, and most every health center. Physical barriers such as condoms are distributed for free in these locations, along with public centers such as the Equality Community Center.

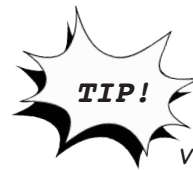
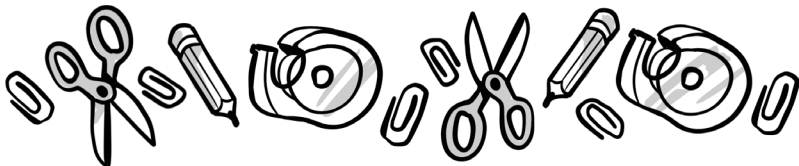

## Changing Your Name in Maine

In Maine, you can change your name legally through the Probate Court in your county of residence. Each county has its own fees and documentation requirements, which range from \$80-135 and may include presenting a certified copy of your birth certificate along with your driver's license/state ID to verify identity.

Every county's Probate Court will require filing a petition and an affidavit, which must be notarized. Those forms are different for adults and minors:

### For Adults

- CN-1 "Petition for Change of Name"
- AF-103 "Affidavit of Name Change"

### For Minors

- NC-001 "Petition for Name Change of Minor"
- AF-101 "Jurisdictional Affidavit"

Thrift shop run by MaineTransNet volunteers.

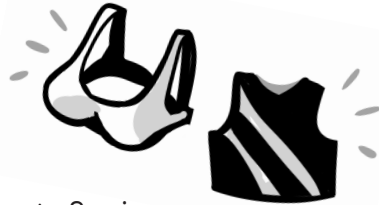
Pay-what-you-can system plus free binder & bra program.

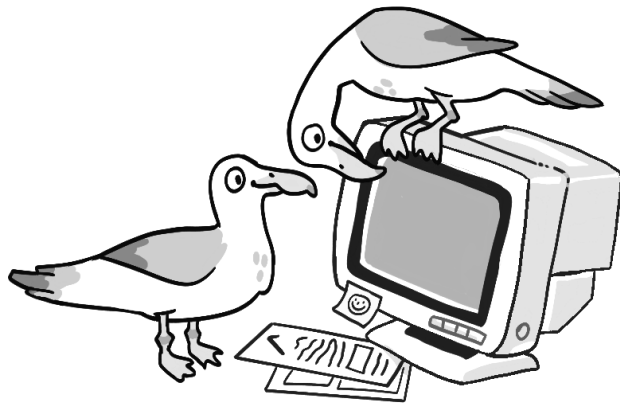
